- * the message given by Jesus and
- * the message about Jesus.

Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ (8:27–30)

At the center of his Gospel, Mark placed Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah...

This crucial passage is the point to which the first half of the book leads and from which the second half proceeds.

(John D. Grassmick - Bible Knowledge Commentary)

The first Passion prediction unit (8:31–9:29)

The second Passion prediction unit (9:30–10:31)

The Third Passion Prediction Unit

Jesus, a Third Time, Predicts His Death and Resurrection

1. Are you sure we should go to Jerusalem?

2. The Third Passion Prediction

Jesus used eight future-tense verbs, implying certainty, in describing the coming events.

1. betrayal
2. condemned
3. delivered to the Gentiles (Romans)
4. mock Him
5. spit on Him
6. flog Him
7. kill Him
8. But the promise of resurrection offered hope for the future.

The Essential Meaning of Discipleship

This incident reveals yet again the disciples' failure to grasp -

* Jesus' teaching on humility (*see notes on 9:34; Matt. 20:21*).

* and that He was going to Jerusalem to die.

The disciples still thought the physical manifestation of the kingdom was about to appear and were busy maneuvering for the places of prominence in it (cf. Matt. 18:1).
